NEBRASKA ENDS SEASON WITH DECISIVE VICTORY OVER IOWA

In Great Football Battle, Stiehm's Eleven Proves Its Superiority Over the Speedy Hawkeyes--Score 12 to 0

Swirling through Iowa's line, dashing around her flanks and scattering the famous Hawkeyes spread plus though it were tissue paper, Captain Purdy's fighting situation swept the last bit of opposition between them and an all-victorious season out of the way yesterday.

It was fitting that Leonard Purdy, the hero of the only Nebraska team that has gone through an entire season unscathed in ten years, should make the last touchdown of the season. After placing the ball within striking distance of the Iowa goal by a mad dash of twenty-five yards through the right side of the line, the gallant Cornhusker leader took the ball again and lowering his head battered a way through the field of whirling Iowans and crossed the line.

Coach Hawley, of the Iowa team, "I have nothing to say except that the best team won. Halligan is undoubtedly a player of higher class and believe that she has as good a team as any in the west."

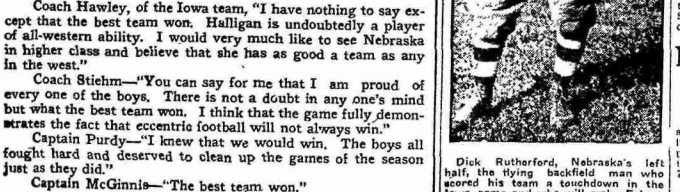

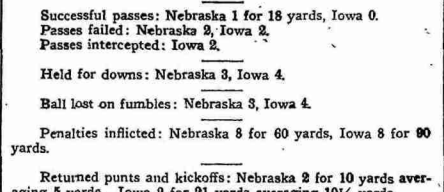
